Thanks to your product, Calmoseptine Ointment, our 495 bed medical center has reduced the number of major perianal and sacral ulcers. I have used your product in a variety of patient care settings and will elaborate on several uses.

By using Calmoseptine Ointment on macerated and/or eroded skin or perianal scald - caused by diarrhea or intestinal secretions, the red, raw, burning or itching sensation is eliminated. Most patients indicate Calmoseptine Ointment to be the first (many times the only) treatment which has provided relief. In a survey 5 out of 7 patients have obtained relief for rash occurring from a medication reaction.


Women with heavy breasts or those who perspire readily may develop irritation and redness. Calmoseptine Ointment has been beneficial in restoring skin condition in every case when it has been used.

In one study four patients with perineal redness were treated for 2 weeks with dermatomucosal agents and no improvement was noted. (Lotrimin and cortisones used during this time frame) - none of these patients displayed symptoms of yeast infections, yet most doctors preferred to treat with these "moist" medications. Once treatment was started with Calmoseptine Ointment, each of the four patients healed within an average of three days.

I have observed faster healing on patients using Calmoseptine Ointment than on patients when Desitin was used, especially when denuded skin was present.
